Dear Friends,

Autumn. I love this time of the year. I love the changing colors (though mostly I have to go somewhere else to see the fall colors since the pine trees that are so ubiquitous to our area are pretty much always green). I love the crisp, cool, dry air. I love how the blue of the sky seems to intensify with the cooler temperatures. I love that the gatherings of friends and families that begin in November and make their way into December.

I love Thanksgiving.

In many ways, the Thanksgiving holiday is a forgotten holiday – at least commercially. The retailers jump from Halloween directly to Christmas. But that's okay, because it means that Thanksgiving is a bit of a quieter holiday. I like the quiet, because it gives us an opportunity to focus on the reason for the holiday: to give thanks to God.



Giving thanks to God is one of the most basic expressions of faith. And yet, how many of us practice it with enough regularity? How many of us start each day by thanking God for the day as a gift and an opportunity – a gift, in that it is a new day in which we have been given life; and an opportunity in that each day presents a chance for us to use the day to serve God and love God?

I recently made a search of the term "give thanks" on a Bible search engine. Of the twenty-seven times that phrase appears as an exhortation or personal commitment (e.g., "Give thanks to the Lord" or "I will give thanks to God"), the reason for giving thanks that was cited more than any other reason is this: "for his (God's) love endures forever." Eleven of the twenty-seven times the writer exhorts us to give thanks, it is simply because of God's eternal, steadfast, unconditional love.

When you think of it, why do we need any other reason to give thanks to God? Isn't God's love enough?

You see, God's love is the source of every blessing you and I receive – blessings which, on a daily basis are far too numerous for us to count. God's love is reason for comfort in the midst of trial and tribulation. God's love is the reason for hope in the midst of despair. God's love is cause for joy and happiness. God's love is our inspiration to love – to love God, and to love our neighbor, and to love one another. God's love is the basis for our hope of eternal life.

Give thanks to the Lord for his love endures forever.

Life is so much better when gratitude informs our perspective. Start each day with gratitude. Fill each day with gratitude. End each day with gratitude.

Your life will be better for it. I promise.

Give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures forever.

Give thanks in all circumstances; for this God's will for you in Christ Jesus.



SERVICE TO COMMUNITY UPDATE

Helping Hands Food Pantry: In addition to our much needed end of month normal food donations to Helping Hands on 29 OCTOBER (and upcoming this month on the 26th) NOVEMBER presents several other opportunities to assist Helping Hands in providing a traditional Thanksgiving meal to those less fortunate in our community. Typically Helping Hands assists 400 families have a nicer Thanksgiving meal than they otherwise could afford.

1. Special Thanksgiving meal food donations began to be collected here at GPC on October 25th and the Thanksgiving items can be left in the decorated boxes in the Narthex, the Connector, and outside the Fellowship Hall through 8 November. On the 9th they will be delivered to Helping Hands. Items desired to make up the special food distribution are:

- boxed potatoes

- cake mix/frosting

- rice

- yams

- macaroni and cheese

- canned vegetables

- gravy

- stuffing mix

- cornbread/biscuit mix

- canned fruit

- cranberry sauce

- piecrust/fruit filling

2. Volunteers are needed at Helping Hands, on Monday 13 Nov thru Thursday 16 November in two shifts of two and a half hours each, beginning at 9:30 and 11:30 to assist in readying the Food Pantry shelves for the Thanksgiving meal item distribution the following week. Sign up sheets are posted in the hallway outside the Fellowship Hall. Please consider helping others in our community through this outreach effort.

3. *Helping Hands* will also need volunteer support on *Monday 20 November and Tuesday* 21 *November* at their building to assist in the distribution of the Thanksgiving meal items to families coming to the Food Pantry. Sign up sheets for these shifts (10:00 AM to noon) are also in the hallway outside the Fellowship Hall. We need volunteers to give their time for this special holiday event.

GPC Back Pack Buddy program with Kensington Elementary School: Beginning this month, Georgetown Presbyterian is joining two other local churches who have already partnered with Kensington Elementary School to provide weekend meal nutritional support to especially needy children from now until the end of the school year. GPC will be responsible for providing lunch bags every Friday for 10 children to supplement their SAT/SUN meals. To maintain uniformity in the food items provided, the Service to Community committee will purchase the items in bulk but we will, at various times, ask existing GPC organizations such as the Men's Breakfast group, Bag Lunch Bible Study attendees, Youth Groups, Presbyterian Women Circles etc. to give us a few minutes of help at their gatherings to pack up the bags for a given week. Service to Community members will deliver the lunch bags to Kensington Elementary.

Cumberland AME church rebuilding assistance: GPC Service to Community Committee recommended and the Session agreed to support a local Christian congregation in great need. We are providing a grant of \$4,000 to the Cumberland AME church to assist them in rebuilding their church which was recently destroyed by fire.

As always Debbie will provide a wonderful meal of dishes and desserts especially requested by the children. Manna in the Morning November, 2017

"Then the Lord said... 'I will rain down bread from heaven for you. The people are to go out each day and gather enough for that day.' ... The people of Israel called the bread manna." Numbers 16:4, 31

"One does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord." Deuteronomy 8:3

Won't you take time each day to let God speak to you through His Word? Listed below is a series of daily readings from the Bible. You are encouraged to spend a few minutes in the morning to let the scriptures soak into your heart. You may choose to begin each day by reading the psalm of the week. There is a single text listed for each weekday and Saturday; the Sunday texts are the Old Testament, Epistle and Gospel lectionary selections that are incorporated into our worship services (Note: during the time between Easter and Pentecost, the Old Testament lesson is replaced by a reading from Acts). One suggestion for daily reading would be to engage with the text through a process known as "Lectio Divina" (a Latin term that simply means "Divine Reading."
